

Criteria for Certification for CEEBL's Postgraduate Training Workshops:

If students wish to receive certification for CEEBL's Post-graduate Training Workshops, they will need to meet the criteria listed for completion of the online module, which includes the following:

1. They will successfully complete the 6-week module, for which the pilot is going live on 10 September 2009; students will complete weekly reading and writing assignments on time, of which there are four; as well they will participate in online discussions of each other's written work.

Criteria for acceptable reflective and response essays include:

- well-written and largely error free;
 - illustrative of effort and following directions as specified in the assignments page;
 - timely completion and
 - consistent with the expected word length.
2. In addition, students will need to have taken the three face-to-face workshops offered by CEEBL:
 - "Designing Tutorial Exercises: Triggers",
 - "Help! I've got a tutorial!", and
 - "Group Dynamics".

They will have to submit a portion of their Dialectical notebooks, as soon as they have completed the F2F workshop on Triggers; in addition, they will also provide a brief reflection essay of no more than 300 words explaining how they plan to use the workshop materials and information in their teaching. Submissions can be made via the dropbox in Blackboard or submitted hardcopies to CEEBL.
